The rehabilitation of the Pleasureville Standpipe has been successfully completed as of June 2025.

Originally erected in 1979, the standpipe last underwent rehabilitation in 1990. With a capacity of 504,000 gallons, standing 76 feet tall and 35 feet wide, the structure now features several key upgrades including new access hatches, a tank mixer, and enhanced safety additions.

This project ensures over 20 years of continued reliability, supporting our commitment to delivering “that good York Water” to our customers.

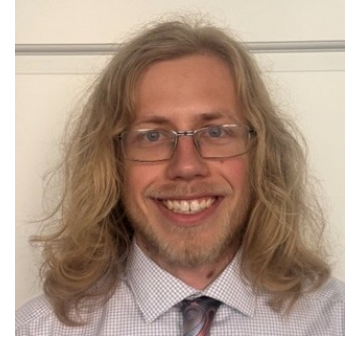

We recently completed the annual basin cleaning at the Filter Plant. During this process we take Settling Basin #3 and #4 out of service and drain them, one at a time. We pump all the mud at the bottom to the lagoons, and once that is cleaned, we then replace wheels, cables and other worn parts on the collection sweeps. We also make spot weld repairs on the pipe work and inspect the integrity of the basins as a whole. This is very time consuming and labor intensive. From start to finish, each basin takes a little over a week.

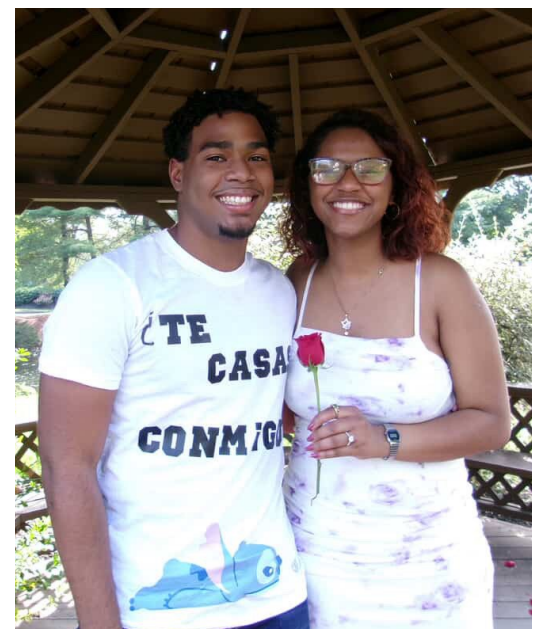
The Engineering and Construction teams have been collaborating with PennDOT and CS Davidson to develop a plan to replace the existing I-83 and Mill Creek crossing at N Sherman Street. CS Davidson and York Water are finalizing the design for a new 16" HDD under Mill Creek and I-83 that will replace pre-1940s parallel mains and increase the main size from 12-inch up to 16-inch. All of this will be done as work prior to the start of PennDOT's construction, which means that PennDOT will be sharing 50% of the design and construction costs, which is a win for York Water and its customers.

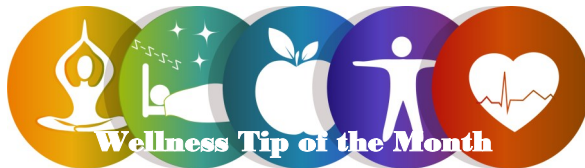
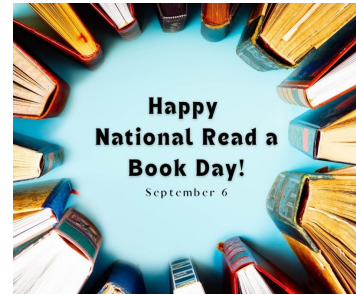
